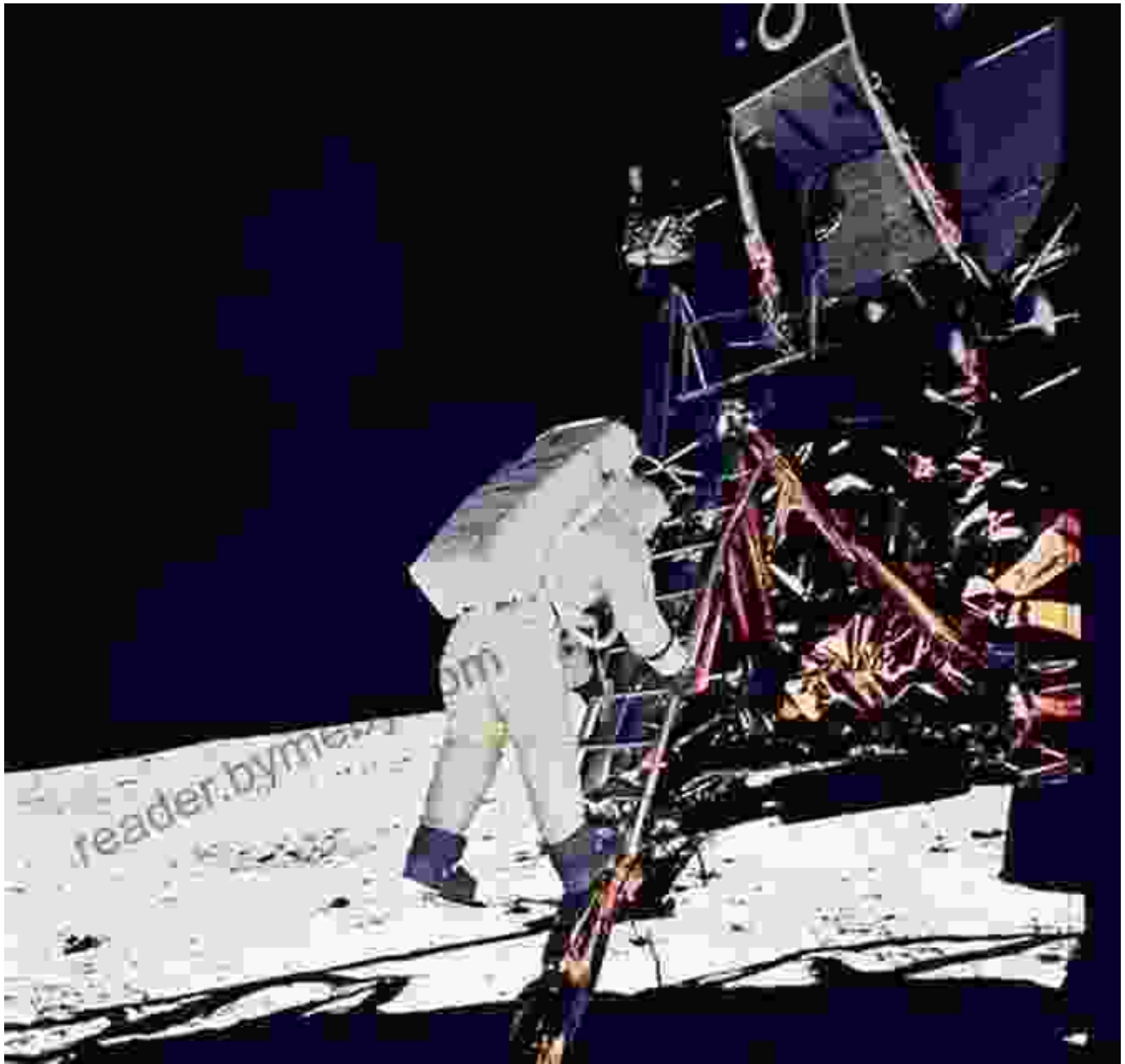


Neil Armstrong in his NASA spacesuit.

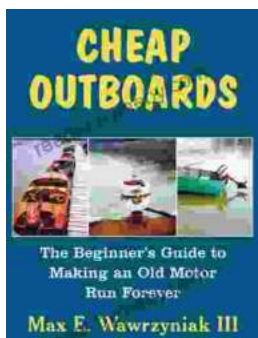

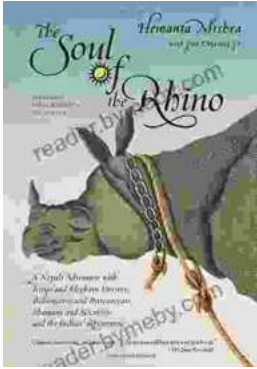
